

Called to Action:

When we were baptized we were given the gift of a personal vocation to follow Jesus Christ and to accept the commitments and responsibilities this vocation entails. We are called to recognize and use our God-given talents and resources as we go forth in mission.

Commitment to Jesus is not expressed in a single action, or even a number of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life. It means abandoning one's self to the Lord and trusting completely God will always hold us in "the palm of his hand."

- Realize we are children of God and share the Spirit of God.
- Recognize we have been blessed with many gifts.
- Accept responsibility to share these gifts in gratitude.

Our Campus Ministry Response:



- The intellectual tradition of the Church by providing an environment in which those engaged in the Academic Apostolate can appropriate the faith.
- The human talents of faculty and students by encouraging them to develop their gifts as leaders for the Church and the world.
- The community of faith by offering opportunities to faculty, students, and staff to co-create with the Spirit of God vibrant sacramental experiences of worship and service.
- The development of financial and capital resources necessary to fund the diverse and growing populations of college faculty and students by paying just salaries, by providing outstanding programs commensurate with the dignity of the Gospel and the talent of faculty and students, and by insuring facilities are adequate to the needs of Campus Ministry.
