**IRA ROLLOVER**

If you have reached the age of 70.5, the age when you are required to take a minimum distribution from your IRA, you can, instead, make a direct charitable contribution from your IRA and avoid paying taxes on those funds. You can contribute more than your Required Minimum Distribution to charity as long as you do not exceed \$100,000 in a calendar year.


To qualify, the check cannot be made payable to the IRA owner, it must be made payable directly to the charity (a check payable to the charity can be sent to the IRA owner and forwarded). Please consider making a year-end IRA gift to Newman Center and save on taxes!

**THE POWER OF A GIFT OF STOCK**

If you have securities that have increased in value since their purchase, consider using these assets to fund charitable gifts. By giving securities: cash is preserved, current income tax savings generated, and relief of capital gains and other tax that would have been due on a sale... all while making a significant charitable gift! Then, use the cash to replace the stock with a cost basis equal to today’s value.
