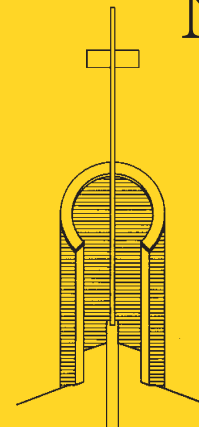
**Calling All Alumni:**
