

Jay Richards - The Human Advantage: The Future of Work in the Digital Age

The Catholic University of America business professor, Jay Richards will give us a road map to follow to maximize our work potential in the rise of the digital age on Tuesday, October 23rd from 7:00-8:00 pm. With expertise in philosophy, theology and intelligent design, Dr. Richards will highlight the 5 virtues for happiness and success in our wired-up world. He will illustrate, in the midst of exponential changes in technology, we have the opportunity to tap into a deeper level of our humanity. In the face of smart machines, Jay Richards will identify the roadblocks that keep us from reaching our dreams. He will hone in on virtues which have sustained civilization for centuries. Come join us on Tuesday, October 23rd to recognize what YOU bring to a fast paced technological world that is uniquely human!

Dr. Jay Richards is currently a Research Professor in the Busch School of Business at The Catholic University of America in Washington DC, with a Ph.D., in philosophy and theology from Princeton Theological Seminary. Dr. Richards is the author of many books including The Human Advantage (2018), and New York Times bestsellers Infiltrated (2013) and Indivisible: Restoring Faith, Family, and Freedom Before It's Too Late (2012) and Money, Greed, and God, winner of a 2010 Templeton Enterprise Award. His work has been widely published in various business journals, such as The Harvard Business Review, Wall Street Journal and Barrons. He is a Senior Fellow at the Discovery Institute, and executive editor of The Stream. He lives with his family in the Washington DC Metro area.
