Stewardship: "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." 1 Peter 4:10

Vision: Our vision is to encourage members of the Newman Center family to embrace Stewardship as a Way of Life, to assist members in taking ownership of this faith community, to instill a sense of hospitality and to respond to the call to share their gifts in all walks of life.

The Spirituality of Stewardship: The terms Time, Talent and Treasure are used to describe Stewardship. However, Stewardship is about Spiritual development. To become a true Steward is to become a true Disciple of Christ.

MAKES GOOD CENTS & SENSE:

Great Charitable Planning Ideas....

Make gifts during life to capture income tax deductions, watch how the charity performs as a steward of your gift and see the people impacted

Fund lifetime gifts with appreciated property when possible.

Over age 70.5? Consider an annual direct tax-free IRA rollover. Or for farmers, consider a gift of grain.

Make lifetime gifts to public charities (rather than private foundations) to maximize deductions

Fund Charitable Gifts at death first with tax-deferred retirement assets. Make sure that the will or trust back-stops this bequest.

When selling a business or farm, consider first gifting part of it to a Charitable Remainder Trust benefiting your favorite charity. This allows you to (1) obtain some deduction in the year of the sale and (2) avoid capital gains tax in the year of sale


Families wanting to benefit loved ones and leave a philanthropic legacy can leave the "fruit" to their children or spouse and the "tree" to a charity using a testamentary charitable remainder unitrust.

Consider a "zero estate tax" plan with the tax-free amount to kids and the rest to a charity

Dorothy Day's granddaughter, Kate Hennessey is the author of the best-selling and critically-acclaimed book, *Dorothy Day: The World Will Be Saved By Beauty: An Intimate Portrait of My Grandmother*. Dorothy Day (1897-1980) was a prominent Catholic, writer, social activist, and co-founder of a movement dedicated to serving the poorest of the poor. Kate is sure to give a frank and reflective, heartfelt, and humorous portrayal of Dorothy Day, who is now being considered for canonization. Please join us September 26th for this can't-miss event! A special book reading and signing will be at Prairie Lights Bookstore from noon-1pm.

Pope Francis gave his address to Congress on Sept. 24, 2015 saying, "I cannot fail to mention the Servant of God Dorothy Day, who founded the Catholic Worker Movement. Her social activism, her passion for justice and for the cause of the oppressed were inspired by the Gospel, her faith and the example of the saints."
