JOIN THE CLUB



NEWMAN CENTER CATHOLIC STUDIES SCHOLAR APPLICATION DUE MAY 4TH

In 1998 a Catholic Studies Scholarship Fund was established to award students who have expressed an interest in the general area of Catholic studies. On May 3, 2016, recipient Emma Miller Shindelar presented her research of the bible, science and Laudato Si to answer the question: What is Christianity's role in preserving the Earth? As a result of her research and presentation, the Newman Center installed LED lighting in the entry way, stairs and parking garage last summer, and plans to install LED in the multi-purpose room and lounge this summer. This change has decreased our carbon footprint and reduced our electrical bill by -13%.

We are looking for a student who would be interested in researching over the summer publications by Dr. Jay Richards and presenting their research, September 2018. Dr. Jay Richards will be the first speaker in the fields of Business, Economics and Entrepreneurship on October 23, 2018, sponsored by the Rossi Center for Faith and Culture. Richards is a professor at The Busch School of Business at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. He has a Ph.D. in philosophy and theology from Princeton Theological Seminary, a Master of Divinity, Master of Theology, and a B.A. with majors in Political Science and Religion. Jay W. Richards, Ph.D., is author of many books including the New York Times bestsellers *Infiltrated* and *Indivisible*. He is also the author of *Money, Greed, and God*; *The Privileged Planet* and *The Hobbit Party*. His new book coming out this June is *The Human Advantage*. Richards' articles and essays have been published in *The Harvard Business Review*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Barron's*, *Washington Post*, *Forbes*, and a wide variety of other publications. His topics range from culture, economics, and public policy to natural science, technology, and the environment. He is also executive producer of documentaries, that appeared widely on PBS—*The Call of the Entrepreneur*, *The Birth of Freedom*, and *The Privileged Planet*.
