**ANNUAL FUND:**

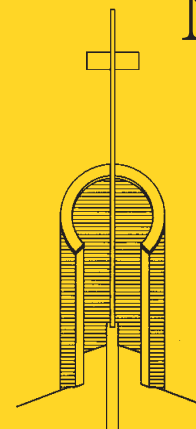

#### DR. WES ELY – MAXIMIZING DIGNITY AT END OF LIFE: INSIGHTS FROM THE ICU

**Thursday, April 11, 7 p.m. – 8 p.m. [Multi-purpose room]** Dr. Wes Ely doesn't leave his faith at the ICU door. In his role as a critical care doctor in the ICU, he sees end-of-life issues just about every day. As a Professor of medicine at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine with sub specialty training in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine, his research has focused on improving the care, outcomes and dignity of critically ill patients. Dr. Ely has built the ICU Delirium and Cognitive Impairment Study Group, which has been active in research for more than 11 years. The group has paved the way in developing preventative and interventional strategies for delirium that have changed the way patients are cared for in the ICUs today. All are welcome!
