ROOTED IN THANKSGIVING


This year's Fall Retreat was entitled "Rooted." The theme invited the students to become rooted in Christ and rooted in a faith community at the Newman Catholic Student Center. Of all the things we do here at the Newman Center, nothing is as all-encompassing as a retreat. It requires most of the professional staff, all the FOCUS Missionaries, the Student Fellows and those who take on leadership specifically for the retreat: the emcees, the small group leaders, and those giving the talks throughout the weekend. Leading up to the retreat, particularly in the past few years, we have heard from alumni of the Newman Center offering words of encouragement and prayer for the success of the retreat, as well as sharing stories of how important their own retreat experience was in beginning friendships and fellowship at the Newman Center. Both alumni from afar and members of our community have jumped in, offering prayers and financial assistance to remove any barrier we can identify toward more student participation. And boy did it pay off. I would not doubt that sometime in the past there were larger retreats. But since I first came to the Newman Center in 2005, we have not experienced eighty-five people on retreat. Only time will tell the full benefit on those retreatants and the further impact they will have on the larger community here at the Newman Center and on the University of Iowa campus. We are *already* seeing new students getting involved, new groups of students hanging out together and many of them pursuing a deeper relationship with God through prayer and service. So, students are Rooted in good soil.

All this success is rooted in your participation in the mission of the Newman Center. It is your prayer and your financial gifts that make everything we do possible. Continuing with the example of our retreats and using that as a representation of all the various ministries we do throughout the year, success comes at a cost. Our Fall retreat expenses have increased by both normal price increases of things like transportation, lodging and food, and by larger numbers of students. Our total expense for this year's fall retreat is at \$10,000. Our revenue, what the students paid at \$40/person, added up to around \$3000. We strive to keep the retreat fee affordable for students, however, this semester we received more requests for financial help from students wanting to go on the retreat, but unable to afford the registration fee. We see the difference in cost versus income as a true investment in making disciples for the Church and the world. So, we need your continued support for all of our ministries.

Our retreats are just one example of how student ministries are growing at the Newman Center. Thank you for providing the vital nutrients of prayer and financial support to keep our ministry thriving. We invite you to prayerfully consider giving or increasing your giving to impact the faith of college students and make a positive impact for our Church and the world.

OUTREACH & EDUCATION



With so many possible opportunities offered on campus for students, our Outreach department is key to engaging students on a personal level. This fall, Outreach organized many activities for the Newman Center staff, Fellows, and FOCUS team to connect with students and invite them into our community. Creating a community for students is a great way to keep them engaged socially as well as spiritually. The Newman Center has hosted several social events in addition to spiritual activities this semester to foster community and fellowship among students. Faith formation and spiritual activities are at the top of our priorities at the Newman Center. We strive to create a community where students and University of Iowa community members can practice their faith as well as bond as friends.

During *On Iowa* Welcome Week the Newman Center hosted activities on campus and at the center for students to jump right into the new academic year. Months of planning and coordination resulted in the highest attendance ever at our opening week events and an influx of new students in the center.

Fall Faith and Science Series sponsored by the Rossi Center for Faith and Culture

Bump, Set, Spike- During *On Iowa* the Newman Center hosted volleyball on campus and enjoyed getting to know over 200 of our newest Hawkeyes.

Graduate Student Welcome Dinner- We welcomed our newest graduate students with dinner, dessert and fellowship at the Newman Center during *On Iowa*.

Welcome Mass and Kickball- Starting the year off right, we hosted our first student Mass of the semester during *OnIowa* with over 100 students coming together for worship.

First Day of School Photos- Student Fellows and FOCUS missionaries worked together to help students commemorate the first day of classes with a photo opportunity. They photographed hundreds of students, then shared photos on social media and with students to be able to send to their families.

New Student Event- Incoming students were welcomed with a night of Mass, a BBQ dinner, a campus and downtown Iowa City scavenger hunt, student talks, small groups, and prayer. This was a wonderful way for new students to discover what the Newman Center is about and what we have to offer to grow their faith as well as their friendships while at the University of Iowa.

St. Joseph Cemetery in Iowa City- Focusing on integral human ecology, Catholic Relief Services at the Newman Center is engaged in bringing Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'* to our Newman Community. A number of efforts are underway at St. Joseph's Catholic Cemetery in Iowa City, ranging from cleaning and leveling headstones to prayer opportunities especially during the month of November. Our service at the cemetery began with our staff, Fellows and FOCUS missionaries in-service days in August. Students have returned two additional times work at the cemetery.

Red Cross Blood Drive-Twice a year the Newman Center hosts a Red Cross Blood Drive to support our community.

Hawkeye Watch Party- Our Outreach Fellows hosted students for a chili supper to cheer on the Iowa Hawkeye football team versus Illinois.



For the 2022-2023 academic year, twenty-one Beckman High School graduates will receive a \$1,000 scholarship from the Nic Goeres Scholarship Fund. The scholarship is available to Beckman High School alumni who attend the University of Iowa and participate at the Newman Catholic Student Center. In September, students attended a celebratory dinner and Mass in honor of being recipients of the scholarship. "I want students to know the background of this scholarship and why it is important to me that they can stay connected with their Catholic faith. I hope someday, these students can pay this forward in their own lives," says Goeres. A Dyersville native, Goeres is committed to helping students at the University of Iowa balance college life

while keeping their Catholic faith a priority. Goeres, who is a graduate of St. Francis Xavier High School (now known as Beckman High School) and the University of Iowa, began an effort in 2012 to support Beckman graduates. In partnership with the Newman Catholic Student Center to identify eligible students, Goeres has awarded a total of 125 scholarships in the past 10 years through his endowment at the University of Iowa. This living legacy springs from his passions for his Catholic faith and for his college and high school alma maters.



Class of 2022 Gives Gift to Newman Center






FINANCIAL REPORT 2021-2022



Offertory is an integral part of our operating budget and relies on gifts given at Mass. Mass attendance has not recovered from the pandemic and we are still not reaching pre-pandemic figures in Offertory contributions.

The Annual Fund is our main funding stream is supported with a core group of donors in our Founders Club. Although this fund has remained steady throughout the past three years, we have not seen significant growth to overcome the loss in Offertory gifts.

ENDOWMENTS:

We are fortunate to have our endowment funds to help subsidize our mission. In fiscal year 2021-2022, our endowment subsidy to our income and help cover expenses was approximately \$275,000. Unfortunately, in this economic climate, we are seeing losses in our investments that negatively affect the subsidy to our income. The graph below shows the activity in our endowments over the past 3 fiscal years.

EXPENSES

As you can see from the stories in this newsletter, the Newman Center in Iowa City is an active and growing place. Each year, the fruits of your financial partnership and outreach ministries are resulting in more students coming through our doors to encounter Christ. As you can imagine, with the increase in students being served, we are also experiencing a significant increase in our operating expenses regardless of the state of the economy. At the end of fiscal year 2021-2022, we experienced a 14% increase in expenses, which far exceeded the income increase of 4%.

What Does “Operating Expense” Mean?

This is an important question- one that we are asked a lot as donors are normally hesitant to give just to “keep the lights on”. Hopefully this breakdown helps you understand where our funds are used. By giving unrestricted gifts, donors allow us to best utilize our funding where most needed.

Student Programs- Welcome Week, retreats, scholarships, student fellowships, Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) missionary program


Administration- office supplies, phones, office equipment, salary, employee benefits, professional development, required VIRTUS safe environment for staff and volunteers

Technology- computers, software, database, internet

Facilities- utilities, furnishings, maintenance, contracted services, and repairs

Communications and Development- non-student events, donor events, campaign/appeal supplies, mass email capability, postage, and printing costs

Liturgy and Music Ministry- musicians, candles, altar flowers, copyright licenses, hosts, altar wine



What does this loss in Endowment Value mean?

Since the income from endowments is used to subsidize our operation income to cover operating expenses, it is important that we continue to find new ways to financially support our mission.


